Digital Photography:

Participants learn the proper use and care of equipment while creating collages of what was learned during their stay.



Birding:

Through feeding stations and bird blinds, students will learn about a variety of native bird species. Feeding stations outside the dining hall allow for all guests to view the birds.

Art Discovery Center:

Pottery, silk screening, and print making are just a few of the activities offered. The new center is a great outlet for creativity.

Digital Videography/Broadcasting:

Participants film, direct and edit their own broadcasts using information from previous lessons. Broadcasts will be shown during mealtimes so all groups can be a part of the learning process.
